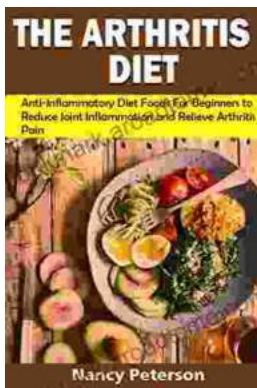
POKER HAND RANKING

<p>1. Royal Flush</p>  <p>The best hand possible, a royal flush consists of A, K, Q, J and 10, all of the same suit.</p>	<p>6. Straight</p>  <p>A straight has 5 cards of consecutive value that are not all the same suit.</p>
<p>2. Straight Flush</p>  <p>Also very rare, a straight flush consists of any straight that is all the same suit.</p>	<p>7. Three of a Kind</p>  <p>Also known as 'trips', three of a kind is 3 cards of the same value and 2 side cards of different values.</p>
<p>3. Four Of a Kind</p>  <p>Four of a kind, or 'quads', consists of four cards of equal value along with another card known as a side card.</p>	<p>8. Two Pair</p>  <p>Two pair consists of two cards of equal value, another two cards of equal value, and one extra card.</p>
<p>4. Full House</p>  <p>A full house consists of three cards of one value and two cards of another.</p>	<p>9. Pair</p>  <p>One pair consists of two cards of the same value, and three extra cards.</p>
<p>5. Flush</p>  <p>A flush is a hand which has all cards of the same suit.</p>	<p>10. High Card</p>  <p>Five cards that do not interact with each other to make any of the above hands.</p>



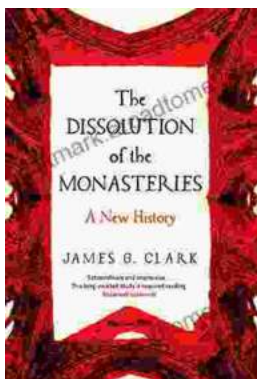


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
