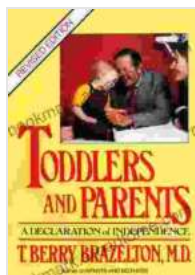

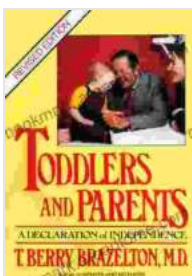
Your book should include:

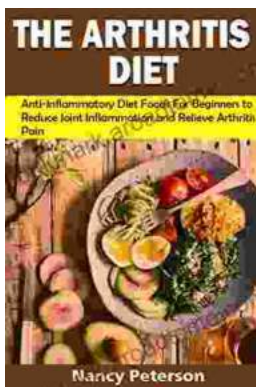

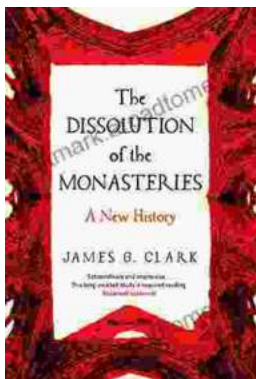
