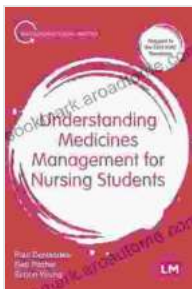

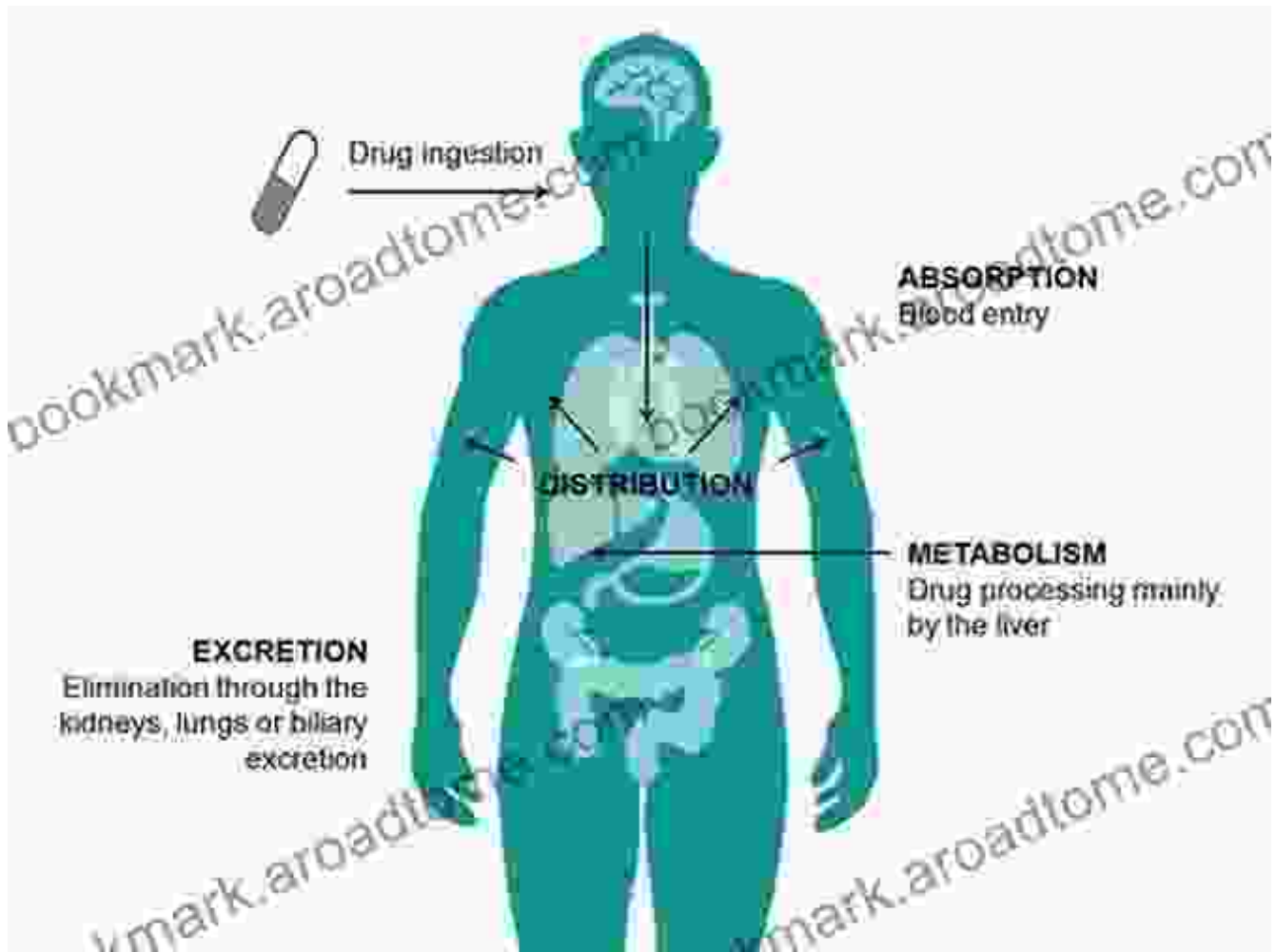

10 Steps to Achieve Comprehensive Medication Management (CMM)

What is CMM?

10 steps to CMM:

- #1** Identify patient that have not achieved optimal quality of therapy
- #2** Understand the patient's perspective on their therapy and their ability to adhere to therapy
- #3** Identify adherence patterns of all medications including OTCs, over-the-counter supplements & herbals/medicinals
- #4** Assess each medication for appropriateness, effectiveness, safety (including drug interactions) & adherence (looking for adherence at the point of medication administration)
- #5** Identify all of the barriers to adherence
- #6** Develop a care plan addressing recommended steps resulting from medication therapy assessment to address barriers to adherence
- #7** Ensure patient agrees and understands their plan which is communicated to the prescriber or provider for support & support
- #8** Document all steps & current clinical status vs goals of therapy
- #9** Follow-up evaluations are critical to determine effects of changes, obtain patient response & feedback (time) & ensure all changes to achieve desired clinical goals & outcomes
- #10** CMM is a reflective process! Care is coordinated with other team members & services/guidelines that are implemented by all team members

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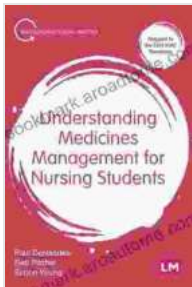

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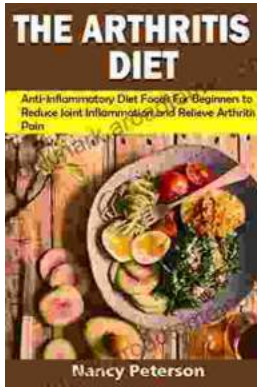
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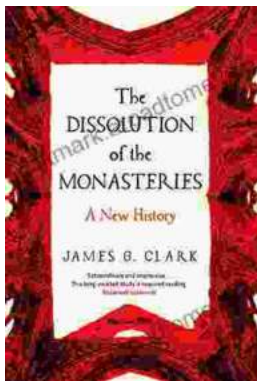
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
